

Conditions for submitting an article to SpacesTimes.net/EspacesTemps.net

The author commits him/herself to submit and, if need be, to publish his/her article exclusively in EspacesTemps.net/SpacesTimes.net.

The article must satisfy the following conditions:

- Author biography (about 700 characters)
- Maximum of 50,000 characters (except [Specific Headings conditions](#))
- Titles and subtitles are clearly indicated
- English and French abstract (700 signs, except for peer review articles: 1500-2000 signs)
- 5 key words in English and French
- The typographical rules (see below) are respected
- If possible, the article contains one copyright-free picture (except for [book reviews](#): book cover used)

Typographical rules for English articles

Titles	Titles always end with a punctuation mark. Italics - No italics for Latin abbreviations: i.e., e.g., ... Italics for foreign words used by the author. Example: ...in pursuit of individual ‘development’ (<i>fazhan</i> , 发展) through...
Quotation marks	Simple quotes: ‘citation, text to draw attention to, or title of a cited article’
Embedded quotes	‘The name “Esmeralda” was not that common’ !!... Except for the title , where inverse embedding is used: “blablabla ‘xxx’ blablabla”
In-line references	To a bibliographic element: (FamilyName, date: page) To a sub-article, linked by a hypertext anchor (see bellow: FamilyName) Examples: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• (Author, 1990: 56)• (Foucault, 1990b: 8-9)• (Nyíri, 2002a, b)• (see bellow: Chemla)• if not indicating author: (: 56)• multiple pages: (Author, 1990: 46-50) or (Author, 1990: 56ff.)• multiple citations: (Yang 1997, Zhang 2001a, Nyíri 2002b, and Parker 2003)
Punctuation.	Attention, no space preceding the following signs: : ; ? !

Bibliography.

Book: Name FamilyName, *Title of publication*, Place: Editor, Year.

Article: Name FamilyName, 'Title of the Article' in *Journal Name*,

In Book: Name FamilyName, 'Title of the Article' in *Title of publication*, Name FamilyName (ed.), pp. 23-157, Place: Editor, Year.

In Book (multiple editors): Name FamilyName, 'Title of the Article' in *Title of publication*, Name FamilyName, Name FamilyName (eds.), pp. 23-157, Place: Editor, Year.

In Book special (when the referred Book is also in the bibliography): Name1 FamilyName1 and Name2 FamilyName2, 'Title of the Article' in NameEd FamilyNameEd and NameEd FamilyNameEd (année), pp. 23-157, Place: Editor, Year.
